

Pupil Premium: Financial Year 2017-2018.

Pupil Premium is funding in addition to the school's budget. The amount of this additional funding varies from school to school and is based upon the number of children in the school who are in the care of the local authority, the number who are entitled to a free school meal and the number who have a parent in the Armed Forces.

Schools are free to decide how to allocate this funding to best support the raising of attainment for the most vulnerable pupils.

ALLOCATION:

In the financial year 2017/2018 the school received £11,480. This relates to seven children.

Due to the extremely low numbers of pupils in the school, limited information regarding barriers to progress is put on the school website so that individual cannot be identified. However, the school does have a Pupil Premium strategy that is shared with Governors and is available from the school to anyone who would like to discuss it. One of the barriers to the progress of Pupil Premium pupils was previously identified as attendance but there has been an improvement in this area.

USE:

All work generated by the PPG is aimed at accelerating progress and moving children to age related expectations or higher. The initial focus will be on English and Maths, where support will be given on a needs-led basis, aiming to overcome gaps in learning.

- This funding is being used to supplement HLTA/TA support to deliver a personalised small group and 1:1 intervention programme.

IMPACT:

The well-being and progress of these pupils is monitored on an individual basis, along with other pupils. Examples of the impact on these children in the year 2016-2017:

- No pupil premium children were/are on behaviour plans.
- Tracking shows Pupil Premium children were/are making at least as good progress as non- Pupil Premium children.
- Most children in receipt of pupil premium had/have good or excellent attendance.
